About PGV

- PGV is an Economic Engine for the Community¹
 - 1,225 jobs
 - \$14,203,000 State and Local Taxes
 - Tenant (airlines, rental car companies, airport security) spending
 - \$266,900,000 Total Economic Output
 - Airport capital projects and operations (construction, facility maintenance, services)
- Provides Convenient Local Access to American Airline's Vast Network Through its Growing Charlotte Hub

 and Electric Aircraft
- Regional Economic Development
- Create Good Paying Jobs North of the River
- Increase Airport Revenue for Long Term Financial Self Sufficiency
- Meet FAA Design and Safety Standards
- Comply with Relevant Environmental Regulatory Requirements as Good Stewards




Design Considerations

- Collaboration with Neighbors
- Environmental Stewardship
- Provide Economic Development Opportunities to Greenville, Pitt County, and all of Eastern NC
- Common Themes for Both Concepts
 - Opaque ornamental fencing
 - Vegetative buffer with trees and evergreen bushes
 - Airplane activity concentrated in development core
 - Direct stormwater away from neighborhood
 - Outside 100-year floodplain
 - Electric aircraft charging
 - Diverse revenue opportunities













































Summary

- Concept 1
 - Multiple General Aviation Hangars
 - Two 16,000 SF Hangars
 - Four 13,300 SF Hangars
 - Aircraft Parking with Sunshade
 - 40,500 SF Commercial/Light Industrial Space Available

- Concept 2
 - 90,000 SF Maintenance, Repair, and Overhaul (MRO) Facility
 - Two 16,000 SF General Aviation Hangars
 - 35,250 SF Commercial/Light Industrial Space Available

Both Concepts Borne by Expressed Interest in Site Development



Environmental Assessment

- Required for Federal Funding
- Evaluates Environmental Consequences of Proposed Action
- Used for Projects Where Environmental Impacts Are Not Expected to be Significant or Can Be Mitigated to Less Than Significant
- Prepared in Accordance with National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Requirements:
 - Council on Environmental Quality Regulations
 - FAA Orders (1050.1F and 5050.4B)

Environmental Assessment Process

- Develop Purpose and Need (Why)
- Identify Resources (Existing Conditions)
- Develop Alternative(s) (How)
 - No Action alternative is carried forward to end of process
- Evaluate environmental, social, and economic consequences (Impacts)
- Prepare Draft EA for Public Review
- Public Comment (30 Calendar Days)
 - Notification to public via legal notices, PGV website, social media, etc.

- Notification will describe how to comment
- Final EA
 - All comments are included in the public record
 - Substantive comments catalogued and addressed
- FAA Review
 - Issues Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI), or
 - Requires Environmental Impact Statement (EIS)





Schedule

- Zoning Process Meetings
 - January 21, 2025 Planning and Zoning Commission
 - February 13, 2025 City Council
- Development Process Construction
 - November 2024 Finalize Preferred Concept
 - December 2024 Submit "Pen and Ink" ALP change to FAA for Review
 - January 2025 FAA approves "Pen and Ink"/Initiate NEPA Process
 - April 2025 Submit Pre-Draft EA to FAA
 - June 2025 30-day Public Comment Period Begins
 - October 2025 FAA Decision
