Pitt-Greenville Airport's Triennial Emergency Drill

Pitt-Greenville Airport (PGV) has announced that it will conduct its federally mandated triennial emergency drill on March 29, 2025, starting at 12:00 p.m. Participants must arrive by 10:00 a.m., rain or shine.

A triennial drill is a training exercise held every three years to assess the readiness and effectiveness of the airport's emergency response teams in handling various scenarios and threats.

During the drill, airport personnel—including firefighters, police officers, and medical staff—will participate in a series of simulated scenarios that involve a plane crash. These exercises aim to evaluate the emergency response teams' ability to collaborate, communicate effectively, and adhere to procedures under pressure.

The drill may simulate the evacuation of a damaged aircraft, the rescue of injured passengers, or the containment of a hazardous material spill. It will also test the airport's security procedures and coordination with local emergency response agencies.

Conducting this triennial drill is crucial for maintaining the safety and security of airport operations. It allows emergency response teams to identify weaknesses and develop strategies for improving their performance, both individually and collectively. By regularly participating in drills, airport personnel can better prepare for unexpected emergencies, ensuring the safety of both passengers and airport employees.
