The History of PGV

The history of Pitt-Greenville Airport (PGV) features key developments and collaborative efforts between the city of Greenville and Pitt County, starting with its founding in the early 20th century. Initially a landing site for barnstormers, the airport's growth accelerated after a joint land purchase in 1939 and the subsequent construction of turf runways by the Works Progress Administration in 1942. During World War II, the site was transformed into a Marine air training facility by the Department of the Navy, which improved the infrastructure before leaving in 1946. This era led to the establishment of the original Airport Commission, which was later replaced by the Pitt-Greenville Airport Authority in 1967, granting enhanced autonomy and control over operations. Over the years, the airport has expanded its facilities to include multiple runways, a modern terminal, and advanced navigational and safety systems, underscoring its significance to the region's aviation and economic development.

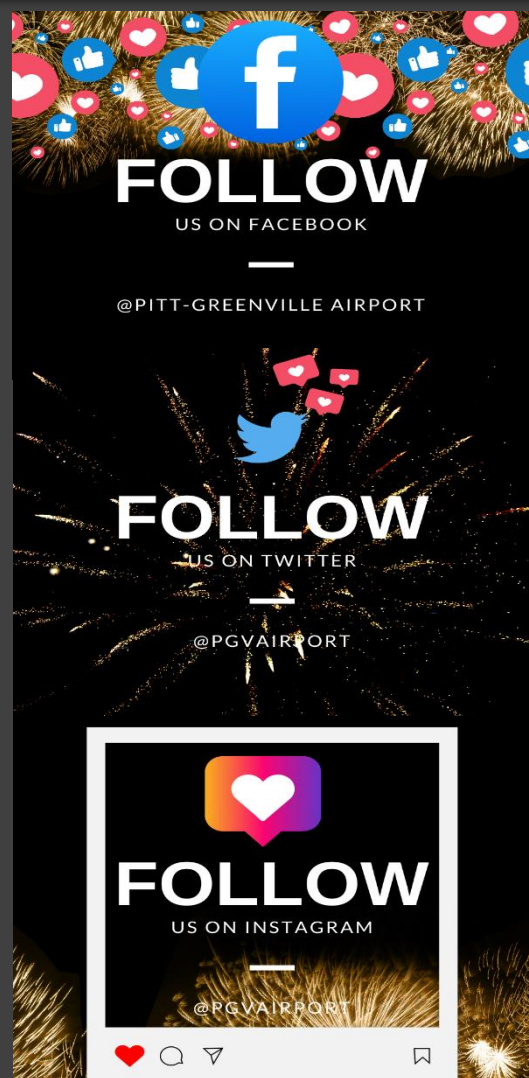

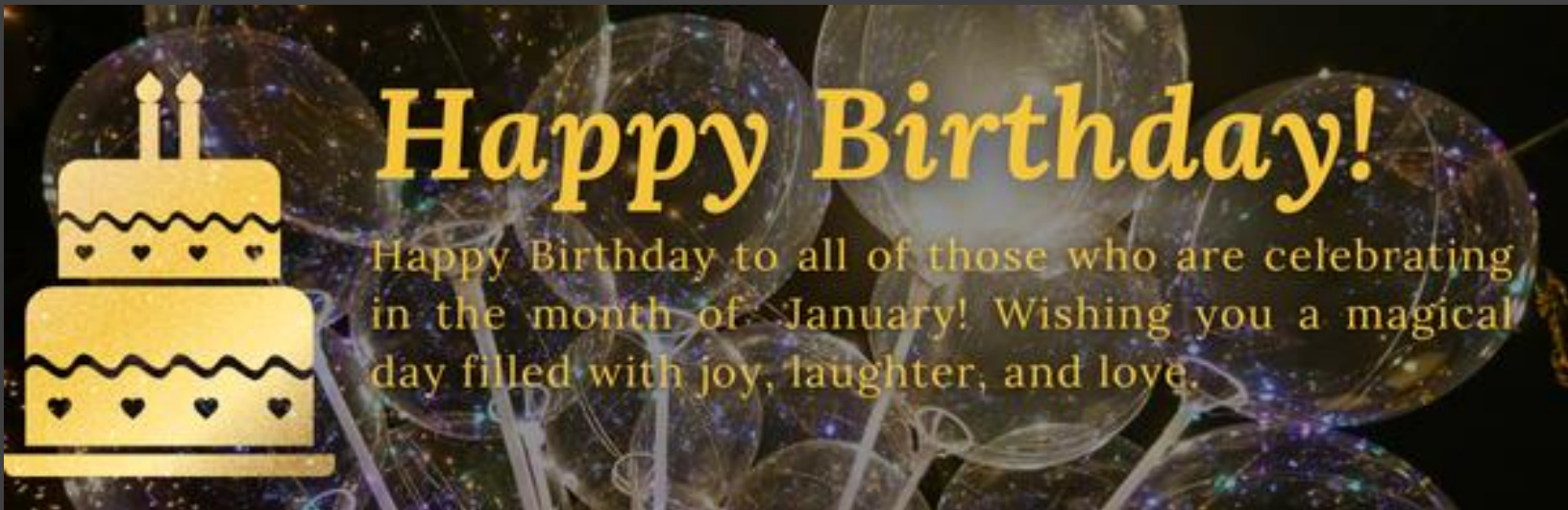
